3. About Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Karad:

Established on August 7, 1986, Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Karad, an affiliate of Shivaji University, Kolhapur is the first women's college in both Karad and the entire Satara district. Karad, known for its progressive educational culture, has a population committed to providing higher education for their daughters. Recognizing the importance of women's empowerment and self-reliance in their chosen fields, the visionary leadership of Shikshan Mandal, Karad took a significant and forward-thinking step by founding Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the heart of the city. Under the dynamic leadership of its founding Principal, Shri A. R. D'souza, the college made remarkable progress, achieving permanent affiliation in 1994 and securing recognition from the UGC in 1998. The college's growth has been supported by an efficient administrative team, a dedicated and skilled teaching faculty, committed students, and a supportive non-teaching staff. Together, they have fostered a scholarly environment focused on meeting the academic and personal development needs of women. The institution remains committed to providing value-based and skill-oriented quality education while ensuring a safe and supportive campus for all. In recognition of its sustained efforts toward academic excellence, the college was awarded a B++ Grade with a CGPA of 2.85 in its fourth NAAC accreditation cycle in February 2025. In line with its vision

and mission, the college is dedicated to nurturing women who are not only deeply rooted in their culture but also equipped with a global outlook - confident, capable individuals who embrace and vibrantly celebrate diversity in all its aspects.

The college offers undergraduate courses in three streams – Arts, Commerce and Science. It has 6 departments at B.A. III level – English, Marathi, Hindi, Economics, Psychology and Geography and 4 departments at B.A. II level – Home-Science, Political Science, Sociology and Physical Education. In the Science stream, third-year B.Sc. students have the option to specialize in either Microbiology or Computer Science. The B.Com. (I.T.) programme offers students both business and tech expertise. The college also offers post-graduate course in Geography. The department of Geography efficiently runs a Research Laboratory affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Research scholars pursuing Ph.D. can avail of the laboratory facilities. The medium of instruction for all courses is Marathi, except for the subjects - English and Hindi where the medium of instruction is English and Hindi respectively. For Science, B.Com. (I.T.) and M.A. (Geography) the medium of instruction is English.

Since its inception, the college has consistently evolved to keep pace with the changing world, striving to provide students with a rich and meaningful learning experience. Emphasizing holistic development, the institution engages students through a wide range of curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities. These include study circles, the NSS, cultural programmes, annual sports events, study tours, research projects, excursions, and guest lectures by eminent scholars on diverse topics. The college also organizes initiatives such as the Food Festival, Health Check-up Camps, Career Guidance Sessions, and Counselling services. Student involvement is further enhanced through active participation in clubs and activities like the Red Ribbon Club, Green Club, and Career Katta, all designed to foster personal growth, social responsibility, and career readiness. Skill Development and Employment Oriented Courses conducted by the Centre for Skill Development are the strength of the college. The centre runs a number of courses at very low fees with an objective to boost students' innate skills. It offers scope for entrepreneurship development and create job opportunities for our girl students. The college runs Balwadi Teachers Training Course of Dept. of Life-long Learning, Shivaji University, Kolhapur, Tally with GST course of

Community Development Centre of Shivaji University, Kolhapur and a Competitive Examinations Guidance Centre. The college has three NSQF courses approved by the UGC, New Delhi and the University: Diploma Course in Food Technology, Certificate Course in Communication in English and Certificate Course in Yoga and Fitness. The efforts of the college in grooming the students for their academic and extracurricular activities fairly reflect in their results and awards in various academic and non-academic

activities. Every year our students win University Merit and State Merit Scholarship as well as awards in other extramural activities.

Samvadini, the Magazine of the college is released every year to encourage creative writing in students. The students and the faculty are offered sufficient quality amenities such as computerised Library, Language lab, Reading Room, Computer Lab with Internet Facility, free wi-fi facility to students and teachers, science labs, textile lab, open-air theatre, well-equipped Gymnasium, Yoga room, Class-rooms with LCDs and Interactive Boards, Canteen, etc. to meet the multiple educational needs. The NTA centre facilitates students, off campus included, to appear for various competitive, entrance, etc. exams. The college has a well-equipped and well-managed UGC funded hostel accommodation for girls with necessary amenities. Administration (maintenance of accounts, admission process, correspondence, issuance of certificates like bonafide, character, salary, etc.) is fully computerized. Mahila Mahavidyalaya is the only college in the jurisdiction of Shivaji University, Kolhapur that begins with a Prayer, Maharashtra Geet and National Anthem. The Prayer is printed on the back page of the prospectus.

6. Admission Guidelines:

6.1. General:

- Admission to B.A., B.Com. B.Com. (I.T.), B.Sc. and M.A (Geography) courses shall be given as per the rules and regulations of the University and Government.
- Students who have passed H.S.C. examination in Arts / Commerce stream shall be admitted to B.A. Part I, B.Com. Part I, B.Sc. Part I and B.Com. (I.T.) Part I classes respectively.
- Students who have passed H.S.C. examination from science faculty can seek admission to B.A. Part I.
- Students who have done D.Ed. with English as one of her subjects can seek admission to the B.A. Part I.
- An Arts graduate with Geography as a special subject at B.A. Part III can seek admission to M.A. Part I (Geography) after passing the Entrance Test of Shivaji University, Kolhapur.
- The intake capacity for M.A. (Geography) is 20.
- There is separate admission committee for each course.
- The principal reserves the right to amend/modify the admission process as and when amendments / modifications are received from the University, Management or the Government.
- Parents/students are requested to go through the announcements and instructions displayed on the notice board before seeking admission to the college.

6.2 Instructions:

- Admissions shall be given on the basis of merit and as per the rules, regulations and ordinances of Shivaji University, Kolhapur.
- The rules and regulations regarding admission to all classes will be displayed on the notice board.

- In case of physically challenged students seeking admission to the first year of the integrated degree course, the Admission Committee may use its discretion subject to the fulfilment of other conditions of admission.
- Admission committee shall guide the students with admission.
- Fees for the Courses are mentioned in the Prospectus.

 Students aiming to enrol for B. A. / B.Com. / B.Sc. / B.Com. (I.T.) I, II, III courses shall submit their duly filled in admission-form along with required documents to the concerned admission committee and keep a photocopy of the same with them.
- The students shall submit self-attested copies of the certificates to the college along with admission form. They shall not submit their original academic and personal certificates (e.g. marksheets, leaving certificate, etc.) at the time of admission.
- The students who wish to withdraw their admission in the first semester shall give an application along with a full fee charged for the first semester. The college shall follow the guidelines of the university regarding the same.
- The students who wish to cancel their admission in the second semester shall give an application along with a full fee charged for the first and second semester.
- Students shall pay extra Education Fees if the Government of Maharashtra increases the same.

 - Students who have passed H.S.C. examination in Commerce or any other equivalent examination.
- **B.Com Part II**: (NEP 2.0)
- i) Students who have passed the previous University Examination (B.Com I CBCS or NEP 1.0) or have got A.T.K.T.
- ii) Students who have done B.A. majoring Economics can directly seek admission for B.Com. II and are given special consideration in the selection of some subjects.
- **B.Com. Part III**: (NEP 1.0)
 - Students who have passed previous University Examination (B.Com.II CBCS or NEP1.0) or any other equivalent examination or have got A.T.K.T.

Students who have passed the previous University Examination (B.Com. (I.T.) Part I NEP 1.0) or have got A.T.K.T.

• **B.Com. (I.T.) Part III**: (NEP 1.0)

Students who have passed previous University Examination (B.Com. (I.T.) II NEP 1.0) or have got A.T.K.T.

• **B.Sc. Part I** (NEP 2.0)

Students who have passed H.S.C. examination in science stream shall be admitted to B.Sc. Part I NEP 2.0

• **B.Sc. Part II**: (NEP 2.0)

Students who have passed the previous University Examination (B.Sc. Part I NEP 1.0) or have got A.T.K.T.

• **B.Com. (I.T.) Part III**: (NEP 1.0)

Students who have passed previous University Examination (B.Sc. Part II NEP 1.0) or have got A.T.K.T.

• M.A. Part I NEP (Geography):

Students who have passed B.A. III majoring Geography and those who have cleared the entrance exam of Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

- Duly filled-in University Eligibility Form along with Rs. 75/- only as Eligibility Fee for B.A/ B.Com./B.Com. (I.T.), B.Sc. Part I and Rs.50/- M.A. for M.Sc. Part I (Admission for a course shall be finalised only after the Eligibility Form is approved)
- A Letter of Guarantee regarding the Assurance of 75% attendance for all the subjects opted must be submitted along with the Admission Form.
- Declaration Certificate (attached at the end of the prospectus)
- Adhaar Card (Attested copy)
- Students from other universities should submit Migration Certificate to the office. The Migration Certificate can be procured by submitting an application to the previous college. The students can get information regarding the same from the office of the college.



15. Facilities in the College:

15.1 Library

Libraries are nucleus of the college. As they are engaged in social and intellectual activities, they are truly the centre of learning. The wi-fi enabled Central library of Mahila Mahavidyalaya is well equipped with a large collection of books (fiction and non-fiction), journals (both national and international), biographies, encyclopaedias, dictionaries, art books, maps, etc. The library is developed considering the changing time and needs and it boasts of approximately 25519 books. Its website - mcklibrary@weebly.com., in-house library system software and a barcode printer have made the library more resourceful for the students and faculty. E-books, e-journals and INFLIBNET are made available to the members. It is e-linked with the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Students as well as teaching and non-teaching staff avail of library facility Outsiders too can avail of the facility on depositing Rs. 1000/-only. Teaching faculty can borrow 20 books at a time. Students can borrow one book on their Borrow Card while meritorious students (those who have got 75% and above marks) can borrow 2 books at a time. Meritorious but needy students can avail of the Book- Bank facility for a year. Other students who wish to avail of Book- Bank facility also can borrow all text-books for the academic year. The librarian conducts a Library Orientation Session and organises a Book Exhibition every year. There is a separate Study-Room with computer facility adjoining the library.

15.2 Hostel:

17. Employment Oriented Courses Conducted in the College:

18. Balwadi/Anganwadi Teachers' Training course:

Balwadi/Anganwadi Teachers' Training course is approved by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Interested students can enrol for the course while doing their graduation in the college. The classes are conducted after college hours. Students must appear for both written and practical exam at the end of the course of the course to receive a certificate from the University.

19. Extension Programmes:

19.1 Competitive Examination Guidance Centre

Realizing the interest of the students and to train them to enter the civil sector services, banking sector, etc. the college with the help of its parent institution, Shikshan Mandal, Karad has set up a full-fledged training centre that guides aspiring youth of Karad and its periphery. The centre has necessary infrastructure, qualified faculty and good study material. It provides guidance by organising lectures of eminent scholars, those who have cleared the exam and college faculty for various subjects. The library holds a separate section for books, periodicals, etc. required for the preparation of these exams.

19.2. National Service Scheme (N.S.S.):

The NSS unit of the college attempts to inculcate the spirit of voluntary work among students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It brings the college closer to the society to achieve community development. It aims at imbibing in the students the spirit of national integration, dedication for social services, dignity of labour, and leadership. The college boasts of remarkable record of NSS activities in the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The NSS volunteers also participate in various activities and programmes conducted by the University, Karad Municipality, Venutai Chavan Sub-Divisional Hospital, Karad and many NGOs in and around Karad .The college has been conducting Special Camp Programme in various adopted villages since its inception i.e. 1986. The enrolment to the units is done according to the guidelines laid down by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The volunteers who enroll for NSS for two consecutive years and attend one Special Camp get a Certificate from the University and benefit of 10 marks in their examinations or preference in any government job. Total Strength of the unit is 100.

19.3. Students Counselling Centre:

19.4 Placement Cell:

The cell attempts to groom the students, and guide them for choosing the appropriate career path, impart knowledge and skill for meeting the requirement of the recruitment process and on boarding the human resource. The cell promotes career counselling through guidance, lectures, programmes by suitable resources. It helps students to define their career interest through individual expert counselling.

19.5 Equal Opportunity Centre:

Equal Opportunity Centre (EOC) is set up to effectively implement policies and programmes for disadvantaged groups, provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters. It helps enhancing the diversity within the campus. The needs of socio-economically disadvantaged groups (SEDGs) are addressed as emphasized in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

19.6 Lokmanya Green Club:

Lokmanya Green Club works for creating environmental awareness among the college students for environmental improvement and to inculcate the culture of eco-friendliness and environmental conservation among them by organising

20. Students Welfare:

22. Food Festival:

The department also organises various competitions like mehandi, rangoli, hair-style, handicrafts, flower arrangement, etc. during the festival to encourage the artistic approach in the students.

23. Annual Sports Meet:

The Interclass Sports Meet is organised annually to encourage students to participate in sports events like – Kabaddi, Kho-kho, Long jump, discus throw, etc. and thereby motivate them to participate in zonal and inter-zonal sports events.

24. Students' Council:

The role of the Students Council is to look after the welfare of the students and to promote extra-curricular activities in the college. Members of the council are expected to bring ideas, requests, and feedback to the meetings. Democratic process is used to give students a voice and make decisions in creating a year-long calendar. Students council is formed in the college according to the statutes of Shivaji University, Kolhapur and the decisions are taken collectively according to the University guidelines. President and Secretary represent the students in the CDC.

25. Gymkhana:

Gymkhana aims at the overall development of students through sports and cultural activities. It offers opportunities to students to play indoor and outdoor games. Following are some of its activities:

26. Alumni Association:

- to work towards the goal of gender equality and empowerment of women/girls in their academic, social and cultural activities.

Students are required to submit the duly filled in form of the Alumni Association on leaving the college after graduation or leaving the college for a Third Year Course to the Coordinator of the Association.

27. Parents - Teachers Association:

The Parents -Teachers Association is an organisation of the parents of all students of the College and the teaching faculty that aims at establishing a positive and constructive link between all the stake-holders. It is formed to provide a common forum for interaction of parents and teachers so as to improve facilities for academic excellence, to encourage parents' involvement in the activities of the institution, to evaluate the effectiveness of the academic activities of the students and the college. The Principal is the president of the Association. The vice president is elected from the parents.

28. Statutory Committees in the College:

28.1: College Development Committee: The CDC aims at preparing a comprehensive development plan of the college regarding academic, administrative and infrastructural growth and empowers college for excellence in academic, co-curricular and extra—curricular activities.

28.2. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

The IQAC being an integral part of the college works towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement by developing a system for improvement in different aspects of functioning of the college.
